

 Clock: 7¢/mo.
 Microwave: \$1.54/mo.

 Stove: \$2.52/mo.
 Dishwasher: \$2.10/mo.

 Oven: \$3.35/mo.
 Coffeemaker: \$2.03/mo.

 Electric Fry pan: 49¢/mo.
 Refrigerator: \$12/mo.

- 1. Set the fridge between 38 & 40°; freezer at 0°.
- 2. Cover food. Uncovered food cause moisture to build up making the fridge run longer.
- 3. Check the seal. Close the fridge door on a dollar bill. If the bill slides easily, cold air is escaping. Clean fridge door seal to make sure it closes tightly.
- 4. Clean fridge coils twice per year.
- 5. Keep fridge full. Jugs of water may help use up empty space.
- 6. Smaller is smarter. Microwaves, toaster ovens, crockpots and electric skillets use less energy than ovens and stoves.
- 7. Use self-cleaning function for oven cleaning while the oven is still hot from baking.
- 8. Use smaller stove burner if possible.
- 9. Keep stove clean. Burners without grease and baked-on particles heat better than dirty ones.
- 10. Keep the lid on. Covered pots and pans need

 1/4 less energy to heat. Using low to
 medium burner settings uses less energy
 and could save up to \$15 per year.








Bath & Bedroom

Hot Water Shower: \$9/mo. Waterbed Heater: \$10/mo.

- 1. Use standard night light instead of leaving on overhead lights.
- 2. Get an appliance timer for your waterbed. You may be paying up to \$240 per year to heat your waterbed. By having a timer shut off for part of the day, you could save up to \$100 per year.
- 3. Make your bed. Covering the bed with a comforter holds the heat in the waterbed. Using a mattress pad can help beds retain heat.

Laundry Room




Drver: \$9.24/mo.

Freezer: \$3.36/mo. Washer: 49¢/mo. Water Heater: \$30/mo.

1. Use cold water for the wash cycle. Most detergents clean well in cold water.

- 2. Set water heater at 120°.
- 3. Hang clothes outside to dry whenever possible.
- 4. Don't overload dryer. Dry heavy-weight clothes separately.
- 5. Vent dryer outside with the shortest vent pipe possible.

 Dryers cause extra moisture and dusty lint.
- 6. Clean lint filter after each load.
- 7. Front loading washers use one-third less water.



Living Room

Ceiling Fan: 1¢/mo. Space Heater: 11¢/mo. TV: 1¢/hr. Stereo: 1¢/hr.

Window Air Conditioner: 11¢/hr.

- 1. Use compact fluorescent lights. This can save up to \$78 per year.
- 2. Open shades and blinds during the daytime for natural lighting.
- 3. Choose the lowest watt bulb that will get the job done.
- 4. Turn off lights/appliances when not in use.
- 5. Inspect for frayed wires.
- Don't run power cords under rugs or carpeting.
 Heat builds up when cords are under rugs and walking on cords could cause them to fray.
- 7. Set the fan of your air conditioner on high and the temperature on medium.
- 8. Keep vents clear. Make sure that furniture and drapes do not block air circulation.
- 9. Adjust the thermostat. 68° is usually a comfortable temperature.
- 10. Lock windows to seal air leaks. In the winter, add plastic window coverings to stop drafts.
- 11. Wrap up in a blanket or extra sweater instead of using space heaters. Even an hour in a blanket will save enough energy to run your stereo for an hour.
