Appellant and other intervening parties challenged a petition submitted by TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP ("Keystone") to the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") seeking certification pursuant to SDCL § 49-41B-27 that the proposed Keystone XL pipeline continues to meet the conditions upon which a permit to construct the pipeline was granted in 2010. The Commission granted certification. Appellant and other intervening parties appealed the Commission's decision to the Circuit Court. The Circuit Court issued a memorandum opinion and order affirming the Commission's decision.

a. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it denied Appellant's Motion to Dismiss, when it denied Appellant's Joint Motion in Limine, and when it took inconsistent positions with regard to the "Tracking Table of Changes," denying Appellant its substantive right to due process.

- b. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it found that the Commission did not err by issuing the Order Granting Motion to Define Issues and Setting Procedural Schedule.
- c. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it found that the Commission did not place the burden of proof on the intervening parties rather than on Keystone and that the intervening parties failed to establish any reason why Keystone could not continue to meet the conditions on which the 2010 permit was issued.
- d. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it found that Keystone properly certified that it remains eligible to construct the Keystone XL pipeline and that Keystone's submission of a signed "certification" met Keystone's burden of proof.
- e. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it found that the PUC correctly concluded that Keystone is as able today to meet the conditions upon which the 2010 permit was issued, and by basing its decision on whether Keystone continues to be able to meet the 2010 conditions.
- f. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it found that the Commission's issuance of the Order Granting Motion to Preclude Consideration of Aboriginal Title or Usufructuary Rights and its preclusion of testimony and consideration of tribal aboriginal and treaty rights were proper.
- g. Whether the Circuit Court erred when it upheld the Commission's decision that tribes are not treated as local units of government and that no permit condition requires that Keystone consult with tribes about the Keystone XL pipeline.
