

Dear Public Utilities Commission

Please reconsider the TransCanada pipeline coming right through an area in Marshall County that is the surface aquifer which flows directly into BOM's water source aquifer. In Marshall County the proposed route would cross a sandy area and this is an especially sensitive area - they need to relocate the route through land with a higher clay content that would offer more protection in the event of a leak.

We can't destroy our nonrenewable resource Water for future generations. We need to protect our children and our health.

Prevention of pollution before it occurs is better and more cost-effective than trying to clean it up after it occurs, in some cases you can never clean up an aquifer completely to its pre pollution state.

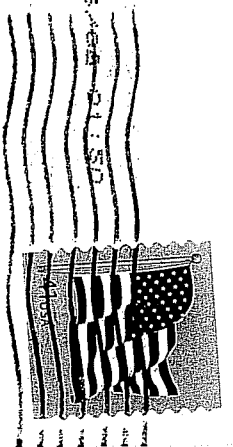
Our farms well is in an aquifer and we also have BOM for a back up water source -
