I hope we can learn from the past and solve problems with some common sense and sensibility and set an honest example for our children.

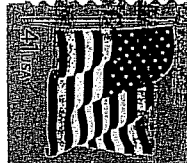
If money talks then I have wasted some lead, but there are not time limits on involvement.
