NG04-003 In the Matter of the Filing by MidAmerican Energy Company for Approval of Tariff Revisions.

Application by MidAmerican Energy Company for approval of revised interruptible gas tariffs. MidAmerican's Small Volume Interruptible and Large Volume Interruptible natural gas sales tariffs currently contain language which would have them expire on June 26, 2004. This expiration was the result of the Commission's Order in Docket NG02-003 which directed MidAmerican to file a plan with the Commission to phase out interruptible natural gas tariffs within a two year time period. Coincident with the proposed tariff revisions, MidAmerican is filing a 2004 Interruptible Gas Rate Plan which is proposed to address the Commission's concerns in Docket NG02-003. In the Gas Rate Plan, MidAmerican proposes to retain interruptible rates but to change the methodology used in its determination so as to increase these rates. MidAmerican's Plan also proposes to add new optional rates for customers,

including those who may wish to switch rates as a result of the increase to interruptible rates. The new Gas Rate Plan is proposed to become effective 60 days after the effective date of tariffs approved in MidAmerican's current rate increase proceeding NG04-001. The interruptible rate changes which are the subject of this notice would replace the current tariff expiration date of June 26, 2004, with the proposed effective date of the 2004 Interruptible Gas Rate Plan as described above. MidAmerican has requested that these tariff revisions be approved with less than 30 days notice.

On May 28, 2004, PrairieWave Community Telephone, Inc. (PrairieWave) filed for approval by the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) its 2003 Intrastate Switched Access Cost Study.

On June 3, 2004, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of June 18, 2003, to interested individuals and entities.

SDCL 49-31-12.6 authorizes the Commission to require a deposit of up to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission's (SDPUC) regulatory assessment fee fund to defray Commission expenses incident to analyzing and ruling upon this type of filing.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL 1-26-17.1, 49-1A-9, 49-31-12.6, 49-31-18, 49-31-19 and ARSD 20:10:01:15.02, 20:10:01:15.05, 20:10:27:07 and 20:10:27:08.

On June 22, 2004, at its regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission, pursuant to SDCL 49-31-12.6, unanimously voted to assess PrairieWave a \$1,000 filing fee, subject to additional amounts as requested by the Executive Director up to the statutory limit of \$100,000. It is therefore

ORDERED, that PrairieWave shall deposit an initial assessment of \$1,000 in the SDPUC regulatory assessment fee fund and shall deposit any additional amounts as requested by the Executive Director up to the statutory limit of \$100,000.

#### MEMORANDUM TO COMMISSIONERS SAHR, HANSON AND BURG

PrairieWave Community Telephone (PrairieWave) filed an Intrastate Switched Access Cost Study pursuant to ARSD Chapters 20:10:27 to 20:10:29, inclusive on May 28, 2004, based on the twelve months ended December 31, 2003. The cost study submitted by PrairieWave developed a revenue requirement of \$2,301,084. PrairieWave's intrastate access minutes of use for 2003 were 18,064,005. PrairieWave is not a member of the Local Exchange Carrier Association (LECA), but since PrairieWave is a cost schedule company its revenue requirement and minutes of use are used to determine the overall cost company rates used by the average schedule companies to arrive at the revenue requirement for the LECA member average schedule companies and the cost company rate elements to be used by average schedule company not part of LECA (the rate elements for Kadoka Telephone Company).

On June 3, 2004, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of June 18, 2004, to interested individuals and entities. No parties filed to intervene. On June 22, 2004, the Commission voted to assess PrairieWave a \$1000 filing fee, subject to additional amounts as requested by the Executive Director up to the statutory limit of \$100,000. (Any questions regarding the amount expended should be addressed to Heather Forney.)

Staff has reviewed the cost study filed by PrairieWave, sent data requests, and reviewed the responses submitted by PrairieWave. Based on Staff's review and the data responses the cost study submitted by PrairieWave should be modified to correct Accumulated Depreciation, Central Office Equipment Depreciation Expense, and Cable and Wire Facilities Depreciation Expense; to assign McCord Red Carpet Dues, Telephone Relay Service and the FCC Regulatory Fee to the interstate jurisdiction; to allocate Customer Services Expense on the same basis as prior studies; to update working loops, circuit miles, and circuit terminations; to correct an interstate allocation factor; to update the Department of Revenue's Gross Receipts Tax percentage to 4%; and to include a non-recurring cost study amount.

The above adjustments reduce the revenue requirement of PrairieWave to \$2,267,613. This revenue requirement is acceptable to PrairieWave.

On May 28, 2004, PrairieWave Community Telephone, Inc. (PrairieWave) filed a switched access cost study pursuant to the rules established by the Commission.

On June 3, 2004, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of June 18, 2004, to interested individuals and entities. No comments or petitions to intervene were filed. The Commission considered this matter at its December 14, 2004, meeting. Commission Staff recommended approval.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL 1-26-17.1, 49-31-12.4, 49-31-12.6, 49-31-18, 49-31-19 and ARSD 20:10:01:15.02, 20:10:01:15.05, 20:10:27:07, 20:10:27:08, 20:10:27:11 and 20:10:27:12. Upon review of PrairieWave's filing, the Commission found that the revised switched access rates were fair and reasonable and should be approved. As the Commission's final decision in this matter, it is therefore

ORDERED, that PrairieWave's revised switched access rates are hereby approved, effective as of the date of this order.
