On February 10, 2000, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received an application for a certificate of authority from Adelphia Business Solutions Operations, Inc. (Adelphia).

Adelphia proposes to offer resold and facilities-based local exchange service. A proposed tariff was filed by Adelphia.

On February 17, 2000, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of March 3, 2000, to interested individuals and entities. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed and at its regularly scheduled July 13, 2000, meeting, the Commission considered Adelphia's request for a certificate of authority. Commission Staff recommended granting a certificate of authority, subject to a continuous \$25,000 surety bond and subject to rural safeguards. Commission Staff further recommended a waiver of ARSD 20:10:32:03(8) and (11).

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-31, specifically 49-31-69 and ARSD 20:10:32:03. The Commission finds that Adelphia has met the legal requirements established for the granting of a certificate of authority. Adelphia has, in accordance with SDCL 49-31-71, demonstrated sufficient technical, financial and managerial capabilities to offer telecommunications services in South Dakota. Further, the Commission finds that there is good cause to waive subparagraphs (8) and (11) of ARSD 20:10:32:03.

The Commission approves Adelphia's application for a certificate of authority, subject to a continuous \$25,000 surety bond and subject to rural safeguards. The certificate of authority for Adelphia shall authorize it to offer local exchange services in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company. In the future, should Adelphia choose to provide local exchange services statewide, with respect to rural telephone companies, Adelphia will have to come before the Commission in another proceeding before being able to provide local service in that rural service area pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 253(f) which allows the Commission to require a company that seeks to provide service in a rural service area to meet the requirements in 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1) for designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier. In addition, the granting of statewide certification will not affect the exemptions, suspensions, and modifications for rural telephone companies found in 47 U.S.C. § 251(f). It is therefore

ORDERED, that Adelphia's application for a certificate of authority to provide local exchange services is granted, subject to a continuous \$25,000 surety bond; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that Adelphia shall file informational copies of tariff changes with the Commission as the changes occur; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Commission shall authorize Adelphia to offer its local exchange services in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Commission finds good cause to waive subparagraphs (8) and (11) of ARSD 20:10:32:03.
