On May 21, 2009, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a request from Northern Valley Communications, L.L.C. (Northern Valley) requesting an extension of its exemption from filing a switched access cost study for a period of three months after the effective date of the new rules adopted by the Commission in RM05-002. NVC further requested the Commission approve the rate set forth in its current Switched Access Tariff No. 1 for the duration of the extension period.

On May 28, 2009, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of June 8, 2009, to interested individuals and entities. Midcontinent Communications (Midcontinent) filed to intervene on June 3, 2009. On June 4, 2009, the Commission received a Motion to Deny Petition for Extension and for Evidentiary Hearing from Midcontinent and a Request for Temporary Approval of Switched Access Rates from Northern Valley. Qwest Communications Company, LLC (Qwest) filed to intervene on June 17, 2009. On June 18, 2009, the Commission received a Motion for Uniformity in Switched Access Rates and for Evidentiary Hearing from Midcontinent. On June 19, 2009, the Commission received an Objection to Qwest's Petition for Leave to Intervene and an Objection to Midcontinent's Motion to Intervene from Northern Valley.

At a regularly scheduled meeting of June 23, 2009, the Commission granted intervention to Midcontinent and Qwest and voted unanimously to approve the Request for Temporary Approval of Switched Access Rates, with the current rate remaining in effect. The Commission further found that the Access Rate Settlement Stipulation that froze Northern Valley's rate at its current level expressly provided that following the expiration of the rate freeze, Northern Valley could request another extension. On August 4, 2009, the Commission received a Petition for Intervention from AT&T Communications of the Midwest, Inc. (AT&T). On August 6, 2009, the Commission received an Objection to AT&T's Petition for Leave to Intervene from Northern Valley. On August 7, 2009, the Commission received a Response of Northern Valley to Midcontinent's Motions for Uniformity and Evidentiary Hearing.

The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapters 1-26 and 49-31 and ARSD 20:10:01:15.05.

At a regularly scheduled meeting of August 11, 2009, the Commission found that the Petition to Intervene of AT&T demonstrated good cause to grant intervention and voted unanimously to grant intervention to AT&T. It is therefore

ORDERED, that the Petition to Intervene of AT&T is hereby granted.
